WHO NEEDS ACCESSIBLE DOCUMENTS?

Your budget books and disclosures serve your entire community, including:

- **8% of Americans who are colorblind** and struggle with color-coded charts
- Residents with **vision impairments** who use screen readers
- People with **cognitive or mobility limitations**

Without proper accessibility, these residents encounter an incomprehensible stream of text instead of the organized information you've prepared.

THE COMPLIANCE LANDSCAPE

Federal, state, and local agencies must meet Section 508 standards for all digital communications (including budget documents and disclosures) by the **deadline of April 26, 2026.**

WHAT ADA COMPLIANCE INVOLVES

Making a PDF accessible requires proper structure:



Tagged headings, lists, paragraphs, and tables



Active table of contents and hyperlinks



Logical reading order for screen readers



Alternative text for all graphics and charts

The challenge: A 167-page report can require 269 remediation recommendations. What takes minutes to structure correctly at the start can take hours or days to fix afterward.
